

The following pronouns may be plural or singular, depending on the singularity or plurality of the noun they refer to...

**SOME** (SOME of the **food** **WAS** eaten)

**Food** is singular so "some" is singular

(SOME of the **apples** **WERE** eaten)

**Apples** is plural so "some" is plural

**ALL** (ALL of the **furniture** **LOOKS** comfortable)

**Furniture** is singular so "all" is singular

(ALL of the **chairs** **LOOK** comfortable)

**Chairs** is plural so "all" is plural

**MOST** (MOST of his **humor** **SEEMS** dumb)  
(MOST of his **jokes** **SEEM** dumb)

**WAS ANY / WERE ANY**

(WAS ANY of the **jewelry** stolen?)  
(WERE ANY of the **jewels** stolen?)

**NONE**

(NONE of this **work** **IS** hard)  
(NONE of their **jobs** **ARE** hard)
